ABOUT US

COVID-19 Resources Canada is a central hub designed to help those involved in COVID-19 research and development in Canada locate human resources, expertise, reagents, equipment and information in a timely manner.

We started building this resource in late March 2020, with the help of nearly 40 volunteers from academia, national and provincial research organizations and the private sector (~5,000 hours of volunteer labour). We continue to receive ~\$500,000 of annual in-kind labour support from these organizations to support our crucial contributions in the Canadian COVID-19 response.

OVERVIEW



Volunteer Database

We have recruited over 4,000 volunteers from across Canada. Our goal is to match volunteers to organizations in need of urgent help.



Funding Opportunities

In collaboration with CanCovid and multiple universities, we created a centralized list of COVID-19 funding opportunities, including those from public, private & non-profit entities.



Community Initiatives

We crowd-sourced over 200 community response initiatives led by individuals across Canada, and globally, including volunteer opportunities and information portals.



Reagent Database

In collaboration with NRC, we built a centralised database to track reagents for COVID-19 related diagnostics and research.



Funded Research

We built a centralized list of Canadian COVID-19 related research projects funded by the loca, federal and international funding agencies to keep the scientific community informed.



Expertise Database

In collaboration with multiple institutions, we created a pan-Canadian COVID-19 expertise database to help researchers find collaborators, and the media to find experts.

OUR STORY

COVID19 Resources Canada first came to life in the early days after the shutdown of Canadian universities and research labs.

Co-founders Guillaume Bourque, a Professor in Human Genetics at McGill University, and Tara Moriarty, an Associate Professor at the University of Toronto's Faculties of Dentistry and Medicine, had separately started gathering people, information and resources necessary for the COVID-19 response.

Moriarty, Bourque and other volunteers from the National Research Council, University of Toronto and McGill University met late on a Friday night on Twitter, and started building COVID19 Resources Canada early the next afternoon.


"What surprised me most about this effort was how fast we were able to assemble a team of volunteers for this project, and how dedicated everyone was to a common objective," says Bourque, who is also the Director of the Canadian Center for Computational Genomics. "I have worked on many large-scale collaborative efforts before but never anything like this. In less than a week, by pulling in volunteers with the right skills, we were able to do something that would have otherwise probably taken months."

OUR VOLUNTEERS


In less than two months, we have recruited 4.000+ volunteer researchers, students and medical and allied healthcare professionals across Canada, in every province and territory. We have mobilized 14 regional leaders to work with 323 volunteers from across the country to collect and post crucial information about Canadian COVID-19 research funding. projects, expertise, reagents, experimental protocols and results and publications, as well as other scientific and grassroots initiatives providing support to or needing support from the scientific community.

We began deploying volunteers from this database ("external" volunteers) to help with COVID-19 responses outside our organization less than one month ago.

As can be seen here, the volunteers registered in our database are located all over Canada and are highly skilled. With respect to education, more than 70% hold a Masters' or a health professional degree. Most speak at least one additional language.
